Hello,

My name is Chris Levy and I am the Chair of the Interim Executive Board (IEB) that has been put in to replace your Governing Body. For those who were unable to attend the meetings held to explain what an IEB is, I will inform you about it and then introduce the members of the board.

The IEB has all the responsibilities of a normally constituted governing body, but is also charged with conducting the schools 'to secure, so far as is practicable to do so, the provision of a sound basis for future improvement in the conduct of the school'.

An IEB combines the non-executive role of a governing body with a more operational role in order to bring about rapid improvement. The Ofsted inspection earlier in the year placed Redgate School in the category of 'Special Measures'. The local authority has, therefore, called upon us as a group of people with needed expertise and knowledge to form an IEB to ensure that Redgate School will be removed from 'Special Measures' as soon as it is possible. The local authority felt that your Governing Body, who worked hard for the school, could not do this on their own.

The IEB was formed at the end of April and met for the first time on 6 May 2015 and have set about introducing an action plan that will enable us to see your school rapidly improve and be judged as a good school by Ofsted in the future.

Soon you will be able to read more about each of us on the school website but in the interim, the membership of the IEB comprises of:

- Mrs Linda Foster works for Nottinghamshire County Council as the Team Manager for the Education Improvement Service.
- Mr Charles Savage is the Principal Educational Psychologist for Nottinghamshire County Council.
- Mr Tony Brown works for Nottinghamshire County Council as an HR Business Partner working predominantly with schools.
- Mr Aaron Connor is a Finance Officer for Nottinghamshire County Council's Schools' Finance Team
- Ms Linda Lyn-Cook has worked for many years in special schools and helped many in challenging circumstances to improve outcomes for children and young people.
- Dr Lucy Morley works as NHS Consultant Child & Adolescent Psychiatrist with Looked After Children.

Reverend Chris Levy is a Governor with over 25 years experience and recently chaired an IEB at another school which has successfully, and rapidly, been taken out of Special Measures with an Ofsted grading of 'Good with Outstanding Leadership and Management'.

As you can see, we are a diverse team but each has been invited to sit on the IEB as they have the necessary skills to bring about the improvements the school requires.

We all look forward to working with your staff and you as parents/carers in order to develop your school into a really good place to learn and achieve.

All the pupils in Butterflies have taken part in an art project to recycle plastic bags into an amazing and colourful work of art.








We are looking forward to next half term when our topic will be Holidays and we are hoping for lots of sunny days




PRIMARY TEAM NEWS










Most of all we really enjoyed our class visit to White Post Farm Park where we saw lots of animals and had an opportunity to feed them and handle them.




UPPER 3's News!


